ANSWERS

Question 1 If no relative is ill: 1 in 100; if a brother or sister is ill: 10 in 100; if aunt, uncle or grandparent is ill: 3 in 100.

Question 2 False. It generally hits between 17 and 30. Onset after 40 is rare. There is also a rare form of childhood schizophrenia.

Question 3 False. Split personality is a totally different and very rare disease. Schizophrenia is a common disease.

Question 4 About 30,000 people in B.C. have schizophrenia, enough for a small city.

Question 5 I. is correct, II. is a myth, III. street drugs may trigger, but do not cause schizophrenia.

Question 6 True. Medications used are non-addictive and quite effective for symptom-control. They do not cure and may have severe side effects.

Question 7 False. Many people believe this, but indeed, those suffering from schizophrenia commit fewer violent acts than the average person.

Question 8 25% will recover, 25% will improve with treatment and be relatively independent, 25% will need extensive community support, 15% will not improve and need hospitalization, 10% suicide.

Question 9 Most live with their families or in other forms of supported housing. About 5% are in psychiatric hospitals.

Question 10 False. Unlike heart disease and cancer, this disease of the brain is largely ignored. For every cancer patient about \$ 400 is spent on research; for every schizophrenia patient only \$ 11 is spent on research.
